My sixteen-year-old daughter just finished a 10 day secular leadership course. She had a great experience, it really helped her make decisions on her future career. The course was well run, and included input from the likes of the PM. I was amazed looking at the content how similar it was to much of the leadership material used by PYM over the years.

In a similar vein, I am often aware when discussing social justice issues at youth group, many of the young people who have studied these issues at school do not naturally connect them to their faith in God.

This week I shared a quote attributed to Dietrich Bonhoeffer in the <u>PCANZ - Ideas</u> <u>for Resourcing Ministries</u> FB group:

"Your life as a Christian should make nonbelievers question their disbelief in God".

Although much of our secular society is based on Christian values and isn't bad, as youth leaders it is important that we are role modelling a radical faith, within a radical community, serving in a radical ministry. We need to be more than entertainers or programmers, just as 'iron sharpens iron,' we need to be journeying alongside the young people we disciple so they don't just hear but can understand it is God that impacts who we are and the decisions we make in our life.

Heartache 24 HR CALL TO PRAYER // 21-22 AUGUST 2020


New Zealand's teen suicide rate (15-19) is the worst in the developed world, it is so high it raises the global average (2017 statistics).
